

1 credit for time spent under DOC supervision between the date of arraignment and the date of
2 conviction. The rules of how credit is applied differs based on when the offender was sentenced.
3
4 The Sentence Computation Unit shall also apply any reduction of term for which the offender may be
5 eligible. An offender may be eligible for any of the following, depending on when the offense was
6 committed: Automatic Reduction of Term; Earned Reduction of Term; or Work Camp Reduction of
7 Term.
8
9 In cases when an offender receives more than one sentence, the Sentence Computation Unit shall
10 determine the inmate's effective sentence. This is done by evaluating the sentences to determine
11 which sentence, or combination thereof, would result in the longest minimum and maximum terms
12 for the offender. Once the effective sentence is determined, all charges remain open and part of the
13 offender's record until the offender reaches the maximum release date of the effective sentence.

15 Upon completion of the sentence computation, the Sentence Computation Unit shall notify all parties
16 of the offender's calculated release dates. This includes the court, State's Attorney, defense attorney,
17 Defender General, and inmate.
